We are in high spirit to share our annual report 2019-20 with all our donors, well-wishers who continue to support our endeavor to ensure rights of our children. The year 2019-20 was one that witnessed many new milestones through the journey that our team embarked upon for children!

Ruchika started its journey since 7th April 1985 with a single Platform School at Bhubaneswar Railway station. As a right based organization, it is presently addressing to the needs of 9000 children & youth of the slums, street and railway stations and about 100000 community people with multifarious activities spread across slums of Bhubaneswar and 04 districts of Odisha viz. Khordha, Puri, Cuttack and Jagatsinghpur. It also has worked in other 05 districts of the state viz. Sundargarh, Balashore, Bhadrak, Jajpur and Boudh.

Remedial Education – Bridging the Proficiency Gap:

Ruchika believes that the long march for national development starts with the first step of every child across the school gate. Our flagship education programme promotes and catalysis universal education among underprivileged children, creates processes to mainstream these children in a sustained manner, strengthens their abilities to cope up with the formal education system, facilitates them to emerge as productive assets and sets the foundation for nation building.

Ruchika reaches out to 6000 children living on the street, railway stations & in the slums with remedial education and other educational initiatives. The impact is celebrated with more than 99 % enrolment, high academic proficiency (71 % of average aggregate marks) in core subjects like English, Math and Odia, 78 % school attendance and limiting dropouts at only 2 %. In addition, more than 50 % of SMC members belong to slums. 65 Slum Education Committees act as change makers in the slum and brought about a significant change in the literacy scenario in the intervention area.

In addition, Ruchika runs special Play schools at 12 slums of Bhubaneswar. The slum children in the age group of 3 to 6 years are provided with play school services and are prepared to go to formal school.

Sibani becomes a Role Model in slum:

Sibani a girl of 10 years of Ashok Nagar slum studies in Class V. Her father is a daily labor and spends most of his earnings in alcohol. It was very difficult for her mother to maintain their family. Sibani was victim of the situation and was not allowed to go to school. In the meantime, Ruchika Remedial teacher learned about her and counseled the family for a few days. Then Sibani went back to school. After an extra effort of the teachers Sibani was blossomed. This year she stood first in her class in Goutam Nagar up School. Now she is continuing her education and become a role model for other girls.

Children are ambassadors of change.

Ruchika formed 80 Balika Mandols and 15 Balak Mandols in the slums with more than 1500 adolescent girls and 200 adolescent boys empowered with education, life skills and self-defense skill are gradually taking leadership in the slums to bring radical change in education scenario. They have taken responsibilities of social development more specifically to ensure rights of the children, prevent child marriage, women atrocities, organize school enrollment drives, fight against drugs and alcoholism thus minimize antisocial elements and reduced crimes.

Ready to care the children in crisis



Millions of children live with violence, abuse, neglect, exploitation, exclusion and/or discrimination every day. Ruchika encompasses protection of children in the family, school and community, so they can survive, grow, learn and develop to their fullest potential. Ruchika helped **554** children in need of care and protection directly through CHILDLINE, a National 24 hours free emergency telephone outreach and rescue service program. In addition, large number of children in

need are reached through the children's club, Balika Mandols etc. Childline filed 20 legal cases in Odisha in police station, OSCPCR, labour department and courts challenging issues relating to protection of the children. In addition, it has sensitized a number of allied system like police, doctor, anganwadi workers, Ashakarmis, PRI members, teachers, CBOs, and has sensitized child protection systems in the districts like DCPU, CWC, JJB, SJPU, State Commission for Protection of Child Rights etc.

Open Shelter:

Ruchika believes that every child has the potential to excel, if opportunity is given. Child care in the Open Shelter aims to build children's participation as well as develop their confidence through the use of tools like workshops, group discussions as well as individual

conversations. We look at the emotional, physical, social and psychological growth of every child and create child-friendly programs, learning modules and knowledge building sessions to aid the process of overall child development at the shelter home and at contact points. It was observed that post counseling children were more confident, able and empowered in their communication and are able to be restored to their families. Some children have also been instrumental in bringing about relevant change in their behavior, taking responsibility for themselves as well as their peers. The program functions in multi-service approach and facilities including three contact points on the streets, one residential shelter for children, counseling, food, bridge course education, recreation, skill development, restoration etc.

Case Study

A 2 years baby went back to her Mother's lap!

In a tragic incident, a 2 years old girl child of a broken family of Maa Bhagabati slum was sold to another person for Rs. 3000/-. When the incident came to the knowledge of the "Balika Mandol" the members of the Mandol conducted an emergency meeting and intervened into the matter. They reported to police and demanded immediate rescue operation. At the same time, they also counselled the mother. Eventually the child was rescued by police with the help of Balika mandol girls and was returned to the mother. The buyer was arrested by the police.



12 years old boy rescued from a Cemei factory:

Being a victim of loss of job of his father, Rahul a 12 years old boy of Jharkhand was trafficked to Odisha and was found working in a Semei factory at Sundarpada. He was brutally beaten by the employer for deficiency of work and was not paid for last 5 months of his service. When Childline received the information, it immediately conducted raid in the factory with the help of local police. He was rescued and a complaint was lodged at the police station. The employer was arrested. The child was handed over to his family with the help of Addl. CWC Bhubaneswar.

Youth- looking towards their future



Indian organised job market is characteristic of scarcity amidst plenty with unfilled vacancies coexisting with a large unemployed manpower. This dichotomy is the outcome of the skill deficit of the potential workforce. Ruchika's marketable livelihood initiative seeks to address this gap by providing underprivileged youth the requisite skills to make a legitimate claim for jobs in sectors which are the engines of growth of the emerging market economy.

Initiated in the year 1991, Ruchika's livelihood programme aims to impart employability skills to the youth in the age group of 18 to

25 from marginalised communities and helps them to attain a basic quality of life and work towards a dignified future. The programme provides for complete integration into the mainstream industry and corporates through specialized training programmes leading to gainful employment. The program include -



1. Tech Mahindra SMART Vocational Training with soft skills like Computer skills, Communicative English, Workplace readiness skills and specific sector skills like Customer Relation and Retail Sells, Logistic and Office Executive skills after which the students are helped to get placement in corporate and business houses and other small scale establishments.
2. Hardware skills like Cutting and Tailoring, Industrial Sewing Machine Operator, Beauty and wellness are provided to the slum youth with placement and rehabilitation assistance.
3. In addition, special Beauty & Wellness Training is imparted to the Transgenders with SMART soft skills.

Sahebarani Mohapatra lives at Garage Chhak with his relatives. Acute poverty make her drop out from his studies after Matriculation. When she learnt about SMART program, she joined the training with CRS domain and did excel. After completion of the training she joined Panda Travels as Sales Executive with a monthly salary of 10,500/- at Cuttack with other service benefits. In addition, she also earns a good amount of incentives for enhancing selling of the products. Sahebarani says, she is indebted to Tech Mahindra SMART program of Ruchika for giving her this opportunity to enabled her to look after her family.



Special Needs children have a right to Joyful life:

As parents / care takers, we don't have the power to make life of our special needs children "fair," but we do have the power to make life joyful. Disability isn't only a health problem. It's a complex phenomenon that reflects the interaction between the features of an individual's body & characteristics of the society in which the person lives in. Children with special needs are like butterflies with a broken wing. They are just as beautiful as all others, but they need help to spread their wings.

Ruchika's aim is to help the special needs children to lead a joyful & productive life. Ruchika is reaching out to 117 **children with special needs** in 20 slums with a variety of interventions like regular physiotherapy, parents counseling, linking them to government benefits, community and school education program etc. This year Ruchika has crossed the following milestones

Smile in Face of Prem!

Prem a boy of 11 years old was born as a CP child. He was found lying on the bed for all the time without much care of his parents as the parents were thinking that he was a liability for the family. He was not able to see the outside world. The Inclusive Education project team counseled his parents and arranged physiotherapy service for the child. He was also helped to take admission in Raghunath Nagar Up School. He was helped to receive his Disabled certificate, a Wheel chair and was included in Madhubabu Pension yojana. After continuous physiotherapy exercise he is able to walk with a walker and is able to carry out his daily activities. Both parent and the child are found very happy now.



Swachha Samudai :

Ruchika helps people find indigenous, lasting and locally owned solutions for water, sanitation and waste management which enable them to change their worlds. The **faecal sludge treatment plant** in Choudwar (Cuttack Dist) and in Dumduma (Bhubaneswar), Child-Friendly toilets in 30 slums of Bhubaneswar, Community sanitation blocks in Choudwar, School Sanitation blocks in Boudha district, Rain water harvesting units in Bhubaneswar are some of the examples of sustainable innovations of the organisation managed by the Community. Ruchika is grateful to Choudwar Municipality for providing lands and successful collaborations to develop these community assets as part of city sanitation plan. Ruchika aims at a viable end-to-end solution for the safe management of faecle sludge across these cities. The Faecle Sludge Treatment Plant is expected to manage the entire faecle sludge of Choudwar Municipality. Community awareness through child to community approach is an important tool used for these projects.

Taking health care beyond the boundaries.

Illness and disease do not respect boundaries and borders. Impoverished children living in unsanitary areas without adequate health services are especially susceptible to all kinds of ailments. Diarrhea, Malaria Tuberculosis, HIV and Aids are very common among the slum population. Ruchika takes health care to all the children in the intervention slums. Health care has already been mainstreamed in the organization. Being a part and parcel of all interventions, health education and care reaches out to all the children and youth. All the sick children are taken to nearest dispensaries. A pediatric doctor visits all children under institutional care on a weekly basis. All children rescued by Childline go through medical checkups.

Diet cures more than doctors.

Slum parents too overwhelmed by poverty to provide their children with adequate diet. Street life is unstructured even the next meal for these children is not guaranteed. Ruchika reaches out to the needy children with special protein content nutrition packages which helps them balancing their diet scale. Nutrition is one of the major components of the children studying in Platform schools and the children who live in the shelter home.

Educating girls to transform society

If you educate a man, you educate an individual. But if you educate a woman, you educate a nation. 46 bright slum girls are sponsored to school every year with all education materials, school fees and remedial education support. This year 04 girls have completed High School Certificate examination. The funds received from WPCPR by Mr. Khurana award is used for the purpose.



Home for Homeless:

There were about 1.8 million homeless individuals living in India as of 2019. Over half of this population was living in urban areas, such as slums on the edge of cities. Ruchika has set up a Home at Paradeep for Homeless people. The needy people are accomodated at night with food at a subsidised rate and other services. During this year Ruchika provided shelter service to 600 homeless people.

Ruchika Resource Centre - RRC

Ruchika Resource Centre is available for trainings, conferences, meetings etc. for NGOs, CBOs, and Corporate sectors. The Conference Hall is a fully air-conditioned, Wi-Fi enabled with LED TV and Projector facility for 50 persons sitting capacity with 24 hours water and electricity and cordless microphones. Two Bedded and Four Bedded air conditioned Guest Rooms with dining facilities are also available for guests.

INNOVATIONS :

Platform School:

The platform school for children in contact with railways is one of the five innovative education initiatives in the world. The objective is to reach out to the children living on and around railway stations, impart joyful education and give awareness on health and hygiene, provide emergency services including first aid. The ultimate goal is to wean away these children from the hazardous place like railway stations and to mainstream them to the society. It has become a source of inspiration for many leading organizations of India and for international funding agencies.

Friendship Education:

It is a completely innovation of Ruchika where children learn from and with their friends. Teacher is to create a win-win situation and make pairs and groups for learning environment. This method focus the experience of the children and opportunities are created to discuss among the peers and to come up with common conscious. The method creates a special ambience and interest among the children so that they at a faster rate without any fear factor and with creativity.

Competency based Learning:

In this method, expected learning competencies are identified and planned for teaching. Teacher collects outside learning materials relating to the specific competency. The teacher also identifies the exact academic problems among the individual children and plan for remedies. In completion of each competency, the teacher gives an assessment for 20 marks and if the child secures at least 15 marks he/she is considered as completed the competency and then the teacher goes to the next competency. After the end of the academic year the children are found enriched with all the identified competencies for that class.

Community Terra Filter:

Community Terra Filter (4000 liter capacity) provides an odor reducing filtering system aquatic terrariums. 12 filter candles fit in the middle terra plate which filters the water. The dual chamber design allows for the greatest flexibility in servicing mechanical filtration media. The water comes out of the deep boring flows to the upper chamber and the filtered water goes to the lower chamber through the filtering candles which are supplied to the users through taps. One Terra Filter supplies enough potable water for 135 families throughout the year. The Terra Filter is managed by the Community Sanitation Groups being formed for the purpose. The users group pay a nominal amount to pay electricity charges and for other maintenance cost of the Filter.

Science on Wheels :

Ruchika helps to create and develop a scientific attitude and outlook among the school going children especially those who live in the slums and street corners. The Science on wheels, is a bus designed with different models on Science and Math visits all intervention slums of Bhubaneswar and reaches out the children every day and impart scientific knowledge. A Science teacher exhibits the models and explains the laws of Science and technology which are used in our everyday life.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Little Scientist - VI

During this year, a Mega Science Exhibition viz. Little Scientists- VI was organized at Samantarapur for two days. More than 200 little Scientists from the slums participated and exhibited Science and Math models for public. This was formally inaugurated by Sri Devendra Joshi, General Manager (CRS), Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd. Mumbai. Many dignitaries including Dr. Subhendu Pattnaik, Addl. Director, Planetarium, Dr. Himansu Sekhar Satpathy, Sr. Scientist, Regional Science Centre, Dr. Chitta Ranjan Mishra, Scientist, Kalinga Foundation Trust, Smt. Banishree Pattanayak, DCPO, Smt. Rubi Rout, Country Director, Adoptions Centrum, Sri Rashmi Ranjan Mohanty, Sr. Executive, Tech Mahindra Foundation, Sri. Bimal Prasad Dash, Joint Managing Trustee, Kalinga Foundation, Sri Anil



Kumar Pattanaik, Former District Judge etc. were present and appreciated the scientific innovations of children. Padmshree Bhabani Charan Pattanayak presided over the closing session.

Sabuja Saishab :

Environmental education is necessary because it teaches us about ourselves. It reminds us that nature and people are not separate.

On 3rd May 2019 the hurricane Fani stroked the entire coastal part of Odisha. Two million trees have been uprooted and cyclone damaged the green cover. Hence to revive the green cover Ruchika launched an innovative initiative Sabuja Saishab in the city of Bhubaneswar. The objective programme was to revive the Golden Revolution (Swarna Kranti) in the city by planting fruit trees in huge number and involve all girl children to motivate all parents to plant a tree to meet the crises. About 1500 adolescent girls from different slums were trained and worked as Green Ambassadors. They conducted door to door campaign with the slogan of "One Child One Tree" so that every child in the family or their parents can plant a tree in the name of the child.



The program was formally inaugurated on 14th August 2019 by Mr. Bawan Kumar Agrawal, Vice Chancellor, Odisha University of Agriculture and Technology, Bhubaneswar in presence of Mrs. Ruby Rout, Country Representative of Adoption scentrum, Mr Biranchi Narayan Mahasupakar, Corporator, BMC.

Aparajita – A program on Child rights:

Aparajita – a program on child rights was organised by CHILDLINE, Bhubaneswar on 18.1.2020. About 500 children from different slums and street corners including 80 differently abled children participated in various activities like games, painting, origami, drama, dance etc. during the program. They interacted with reputed artists, film stars, politicians, teachers and people from different segments of society.

Sulochana Dash, Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities, Odisha, Sri Arka Laha, Sr. Program Coordinator, CIF, Kolkata, Dr. Haraprasad Mishra, Director, Regional Science Centre, Bhubaneswar, Sri Nilakantha Tripathy, Chairperson, CWC, Khordha, Dr. Parsuram Moharana, Chairperson, ACWC, Bhubaneswar, Ms. Andrea Cardona, EU Volunteer from Sweden, Ms. Tatyana Ivanova, EU Volunteer from Indonesia, Sri Gurpreet Singh Khurana, Director, Ruchika High School, all the members of CWC and Addl. CWC, and representatives of DCPU, Sri Rashmi Ranjan Mohanty, Tech Mahindra Foundation, Smt. Ruby Rout, Country Representative, AdopsonsCentrum etc. joined with the children and interacted with them.

Rising Star 2018-20

An Alumni Meet viz. Rising Star 2018-20 was organized in the organization on 22nd January 2020 in order to reconnect with the Alumni of SMART Vocational Training centres and celebrate their success and achievements. 130 alumni including transgenders attended the program. The program was graced by Sri Sudhansu Sarangi, IPC, Commissioner of Police who encouraged the students for their better future. Smt. Namrata Chadha, Social Activist and Shri Jajati Praharaaj, HRM, Pantaloons, Sri Rashmi Ranjan Mohanty, Tech Mahindra Foundation discussed about workplace harassment and remedial measures, and building carrier on Retail sector.



Opening of Second SMART Centre:

In consideration of the success of the first SMART program, the Tech Mahindra Foundation sanctioned the Second SMART Centre which was started at Gajapati Nagar, Bhubaneswar. The centre was formally inaugurated by Sri Chetan Kapoor, the Chief Operating Officer, Tech Mahindra Foundation. On this occasion he met with invited potential employers and discussed the future road map of student's placements. He also interacted with Transgender students at a different forum and discussed with them about their problems of livelihood. Sri Rashmi Ranjan Mohanty from TMF was also present on the occasion.



Awards & Recognition received

In recognition to the innovative work Ruchika has received a number of awards and recognitions. Most important ones are the Worlds Children's Prize for the Rights of the Child (WCPRC) – Sweden which is known as "Children's Nobel Prize", World of Children Award, US, 'National Award' from the Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India, Shining Leadership Award, US, American Public Broadcasting (PBS) has selected the founder as one of the ten New Heroes in the world and has telecasted the work of the organisation in USA, Europe & in UN General Assembly. Outlook Magazine, selected, the founder as one of the 50 Change Makers. UNICEF has made a Film on Ruchika's program.
