When we thought of the day 7th Apr. 1985, the day of initiation of the Organization, we discovered the world of children living in the railway stations and on the street corners of Bhubaneswar in harsh hunger pang. Of course these children have chosen this life in preference to home and family. There was so much to do with them. Giving them love, ensuring food, security, health, education, training and play giving them opportunity to grow into self-reliant citizenship. We had to try to make their dreams realized. We crossed several milestones in the course of our intervention but in every stage we learned from our children. The indomitable spirit of children was our inspiration for work. Presently we are reaching out to 16000 children and youth, with multifarious programs with a number of innovations.

TRANSFORMING CHILDREN THROUGH EDUCATION :

As a flagship program, Ruchika promotes and catalysis universal education among underprivileged children, creates processes to mainstream these children in a sustainable manner, strengthens their abilities to cope up with the formal education system, facilitate them to emerge as productive assets and sets the foundation for nation building.

Ruchika has reached out to 1839 children directly living on street situations, railway stations and in the slums with remedial education and to 13,345 children indirectly in 45 government schools through multifarious educational initiatives. The impact is celebrated with more than 99 % enrolment, high academic proficiency (76 % of average aggregate marks) in core subjects like English, Math and Odia, 79 % school attendance and limiting dropouts at only 1 %. In addition, more than 50 % of SMC members belong to slums. 45 Slum Education Committees formed and the members took leadership and monitor the program.



INSAF, USA has been supporting a special educational initiative for the children living on and around railway stations of Bhubaneswar and Paradeep. Whereas Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar and Basis School of Belgium are supporting Schools on Wheels for children living in the street situations. Foraldralosabarn, Sweden supports a child rights initiative in 15 slums of Bhubaneswar. In these initiatives child protection is the core behind sending all children to school.

A new dawn for Lakhmi :

Lakhmi aged about 13 years lives at Mancheswar Station slum. After Covid pandemic her family migrated to Bhubaneswar in search of a livelihood. Her parents started working as daily labourers. In between Lakhmi's father died and her mother engaged her in household chores. While she was dropped out from the school, her mother planned to get her married. But this news reached to the Balak Mandol members and immediately they took action. They tried to convince her mother and also threatened her about the consequences of child marriage. Eventually, the mother agreed to postpone the marriage and put Lakhmi back to the school. Presently, Lakhmi is studying in class 10 and happily going to school. It was a new dawn for Lakhmi.



AMBASSADORS OF CHANGE :

When youth is empowered, he understand the importance of education and helps uplift the society. An empowered young person recognizes his capacities, self determination and worth. They are full of ideas, energy and zeal to change the society. Ruchika formed 45 Balika Mandols and 15 Balak Mandols in the intervention slums with more than 582 adolescent girls and 128 adolescent boys who are empowered with life skill, education and self defense skills. They are taking leadership in the slums to bring transformation in the community. They have taken responsibilities of social development more specifically to ensure rights of the children, prevent child marriage, women atrocities, organize school enrollment drives, fight against drugs and alcoholism thus minimize antisocial elements and reduced crimes. 105 Peer Educators (Community Ambassadors) selected from amongst Balika Mandols have been trained and took leadership in the community.

CHILDLINE: AN EMERGENCY CRISIS HELPLINE FOR CHILDREN:

CHILDLINE (1098) is the only National 24-hour toll free emergency service for children in crisis (since 2000). During this year, Ruchika is able to reach out to 664 children in need directly through CHILDLINE. Ruchika follows an action process which starts at the first call and continues till the child in need of care and protection is safely rehabilitated. Through this program a number of allied systems like Police, Doctor, Ashakarmis, Anganwadi Workers, Teachers, PRI members, CBOs child protection systems in the districts including DCPU, CWC, JJB, SJPU, State Commission for Protection of Child Rights have been sensitized.

A new born child got a new life:

A 16 years old girl of Chandaka area delivered a male child and abandoned him at night in the jungle besides her village. In the next morning a woman found him crying and rescued. She informed the matter to the nearest police and admitted the child in the hospital. Receiving this news, CHILDLINE members rescued the child and his unwed mother and produced both of them before Addl. CWC. With several days of hospitalization and NICU care the child was alived and was handed over to the Special Adoption Agency. The mother of the child and her family members were counseled and the mother was linked to the Advika program at Anganwadi. A case was registered in the Police station.



Open Shelter:

Open Shelters, a Govt. of Odisha project (since 2010) caters to the needs of the children living in street situation without any family ties. It aims to build children's participation as well as develop their confidence through use of tools like group discussions, workshop and individual conversation. Basic amenities are provided at a shelter home and they get opportunity to get together at three contact points. The most needy children, after rescue are provided with short term shelter care with the order of CWC and are provided with restoration services as soon as their parents are contacted. During their stay they are provided with bridge course education and life skills to enhance their self-esteem, positive approach to life, communication skills and skills to change their attitude. Open Shelter is managed by a Home Management Committee constituted with the membership of DCPU, Superintendent, one CWC Member, one Doctor, one Counselor, one teacher, one vocational trainer and two children representatives.

MARKETABLE SKILLS FOR YOUTH-A KEY TO NATION DEVELOPMENT

Indian skill sector and organized job market was somehow collapsed due to the prolonged lockdowns for last two years of Covid pandemic. Thus resulted a huge number unemployed youth not getting any job due to lack of marketable skills. Many people were retrenched from work place and lost their livelihood. Ruchika's marketable skill initiative addressed this gap by providing skill development training to underprivileged youth. It helps them to a basic quality of life and work towards a dignified future. Ruchika operates the following skill development programs.

- 1) Tech Mahindra Foundation SMART Vocational Training with soft skills like Computer skills, Communicative English, Workplace readiness skills and specific sector skills like Customer Relation and Retail Sales and Office Executive. After training the students are helped with placement services in corporate and other small-scale establishments.
- 2) Tourism related soft skills including Hotel Waiter, Room Service, Food and Beverage production and Driving training were provided with placement services.
- 3) Hardware skills like Cutting and Tailoring, Industrial Sewing Machine Operator, Beauty and wellness were provided to the slum youth with placement and rehabilitation assistance.
- 4) In addition, a special Beauty & Wellness Training is provided to the Transgender persons with SMART soft skills.



Mamali helped to overcome Family Crisis:



Mamali a girl belongs from a lower middle class family, who got married after completing her graduation. After marriage she faced serious financial difficulties in the family and decided to do a job. Since she had no skills she was not able to get an employment anywhere. She learned about Ruchika TMF SMART Training Centre and joined the training. Her interest and dedication led her to successfully complete the course and join in customer service at Lifestyle International Pvt. Ltd. Now she's receives a monthly salary of Rs. 11,000/- for which her family is able to overcome the financial crisis.

Anita is able to earn bread for her family:



Anita an unmarried girl of Puri was left alone with two siblings when her parents were died. She came to know about the cutting and tailoring training provided by Ruchika with the support of Scott Bader. After completion of training she started her own barefoot enterprise and earns around Rs.10,000/- per month. She is able to look after her family.

INCLUSIVE EDUCATION :

India has 2.2% of its population endures some form of severe mental or physical disability. Children with disabilities in India are subject to multiple deprivations and limited opportunities in several dimensions of their lives.

Started in 2004, the Inclusive Education Program of Ruchika with the support of a philanthropic Belgium non-profit organization Bhodhi Project reaches out to 172 differently abled children spread over 20 slums of Bhubaneswar. Ruchika's aim is to help the special need children to lead a joyful and productive life. The targeted children are provided with multiple services including, counseling, physiotherapy support, medical support in emergency. The children are linked to different government services and is ensured that they have obtained all necessary documents. The parents counseling, community education are the added components of the programme. All targeted children have been enrolled into main stream schools and are receiving all government facilities.

Asutosh leads a happy life :

Asutosh aged about 12 years lives in a nuclear family at Jaleswar slum of Bhubaneswar. He is a Locomotor Disabled child who always have problems with joints and muscles. After proper counseling to his parents our health worker and physiotherapist visited regularly and taught his mother about daily exercise of his child. With the regular exercise now the child's condition is improving. He was linked to the Madhu Babu Pension Scheme and is enrolled in Boys High School, Unit-8. He's now leading a happy life.



INCLUSIVE EDUCATION FOR HAPPY CHILDHOOD :

In order to expand our reach to other slums of Bhubaneswar to address to the needs of differently abled children. We started Inclusive Education for Happy Childhood project with the support of Normet India, since January 2023. We surveyed 67 slums of Bhubaneswar and have identified 302 children with disabilities for this project. All these children are served through Community and School Sensitization, right based education, sensitization of stakeholders, family counseling, linkages to service provisions, inclusion in school system and physiotherapy support to the needy children.



CHILD MARRIAGE FREE INDIA CAMPAIGN

On the clarion call of Noble Laureate Kailash Satyarthi, the Child Marriage Free India Campaign was launched in all the districts of India on 16th October 2022. With the support of Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation, Ruchika Social Service Organisation in association with OSCPCR, Commissionerate Police, DCPU, Khordha and other NGOs launched the Campaign at Bhubaneswar.



On this occasion, a march with 750 women leaders and social volunteers was flagged off at Master Canteen Square which proceeded up to Ram Mandir Square. In the evening a candel human chain was organized at Ram Mandir square with around 700 women social activists. Sri Samir Ranjan Dash, Honbl'e Minister, School and Mass Education, Smt. Mandakinee Kar, Honbl'e Chairperson, OSCPCR and many other dignitaries joined the campaign.



Subsequently, by the end of the year Ruchika was able to stop 23 Child Marriages in Khordha district and filed legal cases. 13 out of 23 FIRs were registered and 10 were

GD entry. During this period five Child Marriage Prohibition Officers were awarded by Ruchika for their exemplary work to stop Child Marriages. In

addition, convergence meetings were organized in Puri district with the support of DCPO and DSWO, Puri and in Khordha district with the support of DCPO and DSWO, Khordha.

PURI BEACH CLEANING:

Beaches are found to be the central attraction of tourists. From around 15 Million people who visit Odisha every year 4 to 5 Million pay a visit to Puri. On a given day, the beach gets a footfall of around 10,000 to 15,000 people. Pollution at the beach rise beyond control. To expedite appropriate measures to protect, preserve and promote the beaches in a sustainable manner in order to manage the whole ecosystem a Puri beach cleaning program was initiated with the support of Tourism Finance Corporation of India. In this endeavor Puri Municipality, Puri Beach Vendors Association, Hotel Owners Association and other NGOs supported us. We cleaned the Puri main Beach for a period of 14 days, installed 14 Dustbins, 6 Visibility Boards and created awareness on beach cleaning through different Folk Media and IEC materials. In addition, we also conducted a meeting with Beach Vendors Association and a meeting with Hotel Owners Association and made sustainability plan of Puri Beach Cleaning.



GROW WITH SPELLING BEE COMPETITION :

The children lack proficiency in English due to lack of word power and defective pronunciation. To support the students studying in school and junior colleges, Ruchika has started an initiative of International Spelling Bee with fast increasing word power and teaching correct pronunciation. It has introduced MaRRS International Spelling Bee, MaRRS International Math Bee and MaRRS Scientia Exertus for the students with the support of MaRRS Intellectual Services Pvt. Ltd. During this year 902 students from different standards in 67 schools participated in the competition.

ZERO WASTE WARD :

Poor waste management- ranging from unplanned collection systems to ineffective disposal of solid waste in city of Bhubaneswar causes air pollution, water and soil contamination. With the support of SwitchON Foundation we launched a program viz. Zero Waste Ward in Bhubaneswar. As a pilot project it was inaugurated by Smt. Sulochana Das, the Mayor of Bhubaneswar Municipal Corporation. With this program we organized a number of awareness campaigns with the children, community people and women in ward no 24. The children made plastic gardens and many other home decors with single use plastic.



SPECIAL ACTIVITIES:

86th Birth Anniversary of Mrs. Inderjit Khurana :

The 86th Birth Anniversary of Mrs. Inderjit Khurana, the Founder of Ruchika was organized on 24th Nov 2022. On this occasion all the senior staff members who completed 20 years of services in the organization were felicitated. In addition, the Police Officers including Smt Santoshini Das IIC, Mahila Police Station, Sri Sarat Chandra Patra, IIC, Sri Lingaraj Police Station, Sri Manas Garhnaik, ACP, Zone-1, the Employers who helped giving placement to our SMART students, the Representatives of new partners of change including Reliance Foundation, Care Netrum, MaRRS, Light House, the former students of Ruchika who changed their lives were also felicitated. The invited guests, members and students paid homage to the sacred soul of Mrs. Khurana by discussing her contribution to the society. Cultural programs were staged by the staff and students.



PRERANA DIVAS:

The birthday of Padmashree Bhabani Pattanayak the former president of Ruchika observed as Prerana Divas. This year Prerana Divas was organized at Regional Museum of Natural History on his 101st Birth Anniversary. In this program a mass painting competition was organized and a number of 600 children participated from different educational institutions and CCIs. Selected 20 best painters were awarded with mementos and all the participants were given a certificate of participation.

VISION CARE:

With the support of Care Netrum, an Organization which promotes eye health care, several eye health checkup camps were organized in Bhubaneswar. Hundreds of children and community people participated in these camps and checked their eye health. The needy children were provided with spectacles by Care Netrum. In addition, Ruchika organized a 7 days long eye health checkup camp at Nimapada (Auto.) College, in Puri district and a 1 day camp at Villigram High School, Nimapada.



TOYS FOR TINY HANDS :

Toys greatly enrich play and they help children to develop, they fire the imagination, laying the foundation for improving cognitive and motor skills. They also help children to learn the importance of sharing, co-operating and communicating. With the support of Reliance Foundation, 200 slum and street children were distributed with different types of toys during this year. The children were taught to share these toys with their siblings and friends.



AZADI KA AMRIT MAHOSTAV WITH CHILDREN

On the eve of Azadi ka Amrit Mahostav, on 15th August 2022 Qleep Foundation organized a program for the street kids viz. "Eat Pizza Together". On this occasion, the dignitaries eat Pizza with 75 street children at Dominos Pizza. The children sang songs and enjoyed their pizza.

Annapurna Divas :

Rotary club of Bhubaneswar organised Annapurna program at Rotary Bhawan on 15th Aug 2022. On this occasion the Rotary members took lunch with 75 children living in street situations and studying in School on Wheels. The President, Rotary Club, Sri Srichandan Mishra and other members of the club were present and enjoyed food with children.



DONATE BLOOD SAVE LIFE :

The state of Odisha needs 5 lakh units of blood for the people in need but with a lot of initiatives by the Govt. and other organizations we could able to collect 4.5 lakh units. Hence, we've always a short of 50 thousand units of blood. This year Ruchika organized a Blood Donation camp with the support of Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar and Tech Mahindra Foundation on 3rd June 2022. A total number of 57 units of blood were collected from the camp which was given to Capital Hospital Blood Bank. The President of Rotary Club Er. S.S Harichandan and other Rotarians were present and encouraged the donors.

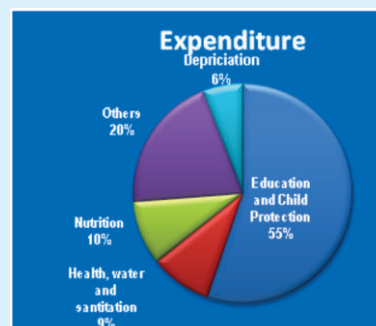
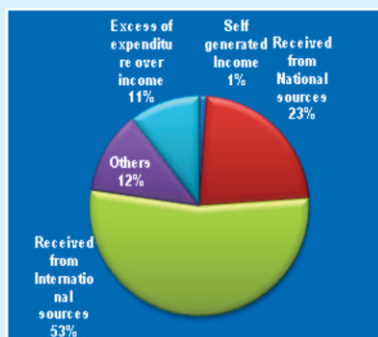
