We are happy to share our annual report 2020-21 with our donors, well-wishers and all those who continue to support our endeavor to ensure rights of our children. The year 2020-21 was one that witnessed many new milestones through the journey that our team embarked upon for children.

It is a recognized fact that when children are educated, healthy, happy, and have access to opportunities, they are the country's most significant human resources. In response to alarming issues of the large scale out of school children, Ruchika began its journey on 7th April 1985 with a single Platform School at Bhubaneswar Railway station. As a right based organization, it presently address to the needs of 9000 children & youth of the slums, street and railway stations and about 100000 community people with multifarious activities spread across the state.

Education is a passport to future :

Education is a powerful weapon which we can use to change the world. The long march for national development begins with the first step of every child across the school gate. Ruchika's flagship Right to education programme promotes and catalysis universal education among underprivileged children, creates processes to mainstream these children in a sustained manner, strengthens their abilities to cope up with the formal education system, facilitates them to emerge as productive assets and sets the foundation for nation building.

Ruchika reaches out to 6000 children living on the street, railway stations & in the slums with right to education remedial education and other educational initiatives. The impact is celebrated with more than 99 % enrolment, high academic proficiency (72 % of average aggregate marks) in core subjects like English, Math and Odia, 78 % school attendance and limiting dropouts at only 2 %. In addition, more than 50 % of SMC members belong to slums. 65 Slum Education Committees formed with the community members take leadership and monitoring responsibility. In addition, Ruchika also reached out to 13000 children in neighborhood schools with right based programs and advocacy.

In addition, Ruchika runs special Play schools at 7 slums of Bhubaneswar. The slum children in the age group of 3 to 6 years are furnished with play school benefits and are prepared to go to formal school.

This year outbreak of Covid-19 in March 2020 has enforced students to stay at home. During this pandemic it was difficult to

ensure online classes for every children under out target as many of them din't have android mobile phones. The situation affects strongly the children as they do not access e-learning facilities.

Ruchika has introduced online education/e-learning programs and tried to reach out to the children though Youtube. Educational texts were made with OBS studio. All possible efforts made to link the children to the community members having an android mobile. Of course in this endeavor our Balika Mandol girls and Basti Education Committee members played a key role to reach out to all our children. With a well-built strategic effort, we ware able to reach out to most of our targeted children.

Slums are breeding ground of all kinds of anti-socials and drugs and the children very easily fall pray in to trap of anti-socials if they are out of school. Bhabani a 13 years old girl lives in Bharatpur Cluster-3 slum and was out of school because of lack of interest of her parents. As a result she was exposed to alcohol, sex and crime. During the enrolment drive, our remedial teacher identified the child. After several counselling sessions to her parents the child was enrolled in Gopabandhu UP School in her age appropriate class. She attended remedial coaching though online mode. She feels very happy and thanked Ruchika for which she could join her school.



Youth ambassadors of change.

History has always been shaped by the power of youth. Ruchika believes that youth are full of ideas, energy and zeal to change the society. Ruchika formed 90 Balika Mandols and Balak Mandols in the Slums with more than 1500 adolescent girls and 200 adolescent boys getting empowered with education, life skills. They gradually take leadership in the slums to bring radical change in education scenario and taking leadership to ensure rights of the children. We help them to recognize their potential as individuals, leader and change maker for the society. They have taken responsibilities of social development more specifically to ensure rights of the children, prevent child marriage, women atrocities, organize school enrollment drives, fight against drugs and alcoholism thus minimize antisocial elements and reduced crimes. The way they worked as change agents in the slums during Covid pandemic was mind-blowing. Be it stitching masks for children, be it enroll every single child into school, be it taking responsibility of all developmental activities in the slums or be it reducing child marriage scenario in the slums or be raising voice against drugs and alcoholism in the slums, they are always ahead.



CHILDLINE- A National Emergency phone outreach and rescue service:

Millions of children live with abuse, violence, neglect, exploitation, exclusion and/or discrimination every day. CHILDLINE (1098) a national 24-hour toll free emergency phone outreach and rescue service reach out to these children in times of emergency. In this Covid pandemic Ruchika is able to reached out to 758 children in need directly through CHILDLINE. Through this program a number of allied systems like police, doctor, anganwadi workers, ashakarmis, PRI members, teachers, CBOs, and has sensitized child protection systems in the districts like DCPU, CWC, JJB, SJPU, State Commission for Protection of Child Rights have been sensitized.

Rescue of a Baby Child from Railway Station

Childline, Bhubaneswar got information about an abandoned child who was thrown in a bag near Patia Railway Station. Immediately Childline reached on the spot and rescued the child with the support of KIIMS out post police and admitted in nearest KIIM hospital for emergency treatment. As the child's health condition was not good so the child was admitted in SNCU for observation.. Regularly the childline took follow up. After being discharged from the hospital the child was produced before Addl. CWC and with it's order the child was placed at Subhadra Mahatab Special Adoption Agency.

Open shelter for children in need of emergency shelter care

Every year thousands of children leave their homes in search of a better life. The cities work as a magnet for them. Children staying on the streets bear the unfortunate brunt of dust, ignorance, hunger, abuse and poverty. Street children are extremely vulnerable and frequently exposed to abuse and extortion. Ruchika runs Open Shelter Program to address the emergency institutional care needs of these children. Supported by Govt. of Odiahs, this program has accommodated 225 children this year. In addition, 170 children have been reached out to through three Contact points.

Child care and protection in the Open Shelter aims to build children's participation as well as develop their confidence through the use of tools like workshops, group discussions as well as individual conversations. At shelter homes they are provided with all necessary amenities. The inmates of shelter home are provided with shelter, food, clothes, bedding, education, recreation, counseling, music, dance, functional literacy, skill training and restoration. Individual care plan is made for all the children.

We have adopted a child-friendly mechanism to deal with the children. The entire campus have been painted by the children and the campus looks child-friendly. We look at the emotional, physical, social and psychological growth of every child and create child-friendly programs, learning modules and knowledge building sessions to aid the process of overall child development at the shelter home and at contact points. It was observed that post counseling children were more confident, able and empowered in their communication and are able to be restored to their families. This year 66 children restored to their family successfully.

Employable market skills for youth

Fortunately, India's job market once again surpassed pre-pandemic levels. It is recovering across various cities with an 89 % annual hiring growth recorded in 2021. However still there is a huge number unemployed youth not getting any job due to lack of marketable skills. Ruchika's marketable skilling and livelihood initiative seeks to address this gap by providing underprivileged youth the requisite skills to make a legitimate claim for jobs in sectors which are the engines of growth of the emerging market economy. It helps them to attain a basic quality of life and work towards a dignified future. Ruchika operates two types of training, focusing largely on women and youth which include soft skills and hardware skilling programs.

This year, Vocational Education and Training ecosystem faced many challenges due to Covid-19 pandemic. The Training center was remaining shut for a couple of months as per Odisha Govt. guideline. The Training was conducted through online which makes the trainees more confident on Technology. Details of skilling programs are given as under.

1. Tech Mahindra SMART Vocational Training with soft skills like Computer skills, Communicative English, Workplace readiness skills and specific sector skills like Customer Relation and Retail Sales, Logistic and Office Executive skills after which the students are helped to get placement in corporate and retail houses and other small-scale establishments.
2. Hardware skills like Cutting and Tailoring, Industrial Sewing Machine Operator, Beauty and wellness are provided to the slum youth with placement and rehabilitation assistance.
3. In addition, a special Beauty & Wellness Training is provided to the Transgenders with SMART soft skills.

Nirmalya Prasad Sahoo belongs to a farmer family having 6 members at Jagatsinghpur. Before the Covid-19 Pandemic he was working as a Hotel Service Boy after completion of his PGDCA and certificate Course in Hospitality. Being the closure of the hotel during the lockdown he didn't find any job. Learning about Tech Mahindra SMART program, he joined the course through online platform. After completion he was helped to join in **Lio Packers and Movers Pvt. Ltd.** as an Associate with a package of INR 9000/- with Incentive and Quarter Facility and was very quickly he was promoted to the post of Administrative Officer in the same company. He is grateful to Ruchika SMART program and Tech Mahindra Foundation for its timely support to make his dream realised.



Inclusive Education- A step to educating children with disabilities:

We all know the fact that persons with disabilities comprise at least 4 to 8 percent of the Indian population. Children with disabilities in India are subject to multiple deprivations and limited opportunities in several dimensions of their lives. Their families and caregivers also go through lot of stress and challenges in having a person with disability at home which ultimately leads to grave discriminatory practices towards these children.

Started in 2004, the Inclusive Education Program of Ruchika with the support of a philanthropic Belgian nonprofits organisation Bodhi Project reaches out to all categories of differently abled children in 20 slums of Bhubaneswar. The program is found to be a scalable, sustainable and community-based model. This year Ruchika has reached out to 178 children with special needs with a variety of interventions like regular physiotherapy, parent counselling, linking them to government benefits, and enrolled them in school education program.

This year the program has crossed several challenges due to Covid-19. 200 identified families of disabled children were provided with a supplementary ration packet for at least one month which includes ration and special food for the child with special needs. 95 children along with their family members were provided with a sanitization kit which include soap, small towels, mask for all members of the family, hand globes for the care givers in the family.

But our regular empowering counseling sessions helped him to go to school. Gradually Santosh was accepted by other children and they became his friends. He completed his 10th board exam with good marks. Now he is taking SMAW Welding Vocational training at Navonmesh Prasar Foundation and looking for a good job. The smile in his face express his gratitude to all who helped him to reach at his goal.

Swachha Samudai:

Ruchika with the support of Pratical Action is jointly implementing the Project “Swachh Samudai” (healthy community) in Choudwar municipality in Cuttack district. Ruchika helps people find indigenous, lasting and locally owned solutions for water, sanitation and waste management which enable them to change their worlds. The faecal sludge treatment plant in Choudwar (Cuttack Dist) and in Dumduma (Bhubaneswar), Child-Friendly toilets in 30 slums of Bhubaneswar, Community sanitation blocks in Choudwar, School Sanitation blocks in Boudha district, Rain water harvesting units in Bhubaneswar are some of the examples of sustainable innovations of the organisation managed by the Community.

Ruchika is grateful to Choudwar Municipality for providing lands and successful collaborations to develop these community assets as part of city sanitation plan. Ruchika aims at a viable end-to-end solution for the safe management of faecal sludge across these cities. The Faecal Sludge Treatment Plant is expected to manage the entire faecal sludge of Choudwar Municipality. Community awareness through child to community approach is an important tool used for these projects. This year 9 community toilets have hand overed to Municipality for its sustainability running. Self Help Groups are taking training for Faecal sludge treatment plant.

School on Wheels to educate Children living in Street Situations :

School on wheels is one of the innovative educational initiatives of Ruchika Social Service Organisation which was started about 15 years back in Bhubaneswar. But due to manual paddling a huge school and materials, the teachers didn't get agrees to continue the program.

With the financial support of Tourism Financial Corporation of India Ltd. we have developed necessary infrastructure to start Three Schools on Wheels on the streets. Three battery operated Autos (Totos) have been procured and they have been designed as schools on wheels.

The Totos have been remodeled inside with racks to display toys, books, keep drinking water, first aid box, play materials, dry food etc. One side of the Toto is decorated with steel frames and made a blackboard. Another side will be used to display Maps and Charts. So that the children can study, play, dance and can do paintings with that. We also have planned for sound system and music for the children.



A teacher drives the Toto from one place to another place and organizes a Learning centre for children where more than 05 children are present. Due to Covid guidelines, the teacher teaches the children Covid Education.

Taking health care is a right to every child.

Slums and street children suffer from many health ailments due to extreme poverty, overcrowding, poor water and sanitation, substandard housing, limited access to basic health and education services. Illness and disease do not respect boundaries and borders. Impoverished children living in unsanitary areas without adequate health services are especially susceptible to all kinds of ailments. Diarrhea, Malaria Tuberculosis, HIV and Aids are very common among the slum population. Ruchika takes health care to all the children in the intervention slums. Health care has already been mainstreamed in the organization. Being a part and parcel of all interventions, health education and care reaches out to all the children and youth. All the sick children are taken to nearest dispensaries. A pediatric doctor visits all children under institutional care on a weekly basis. All children rescued by Childline go through medical checkups.

Diet cures more than doctors

Slum parents too overwhelmed by poverty to provide their children with adequate diet. Street life is unstructured even the next meal for these children is not guaranteed. Ruchika reaches out to the needy children with special protein content nutrition packages which helps them balancing their diet scale. Nutrition is one of the major components of the children studying in Platform schools and the children who live in the shelter home.

Popularize Science among Young Children:

Science is involved **in cooking, eating, breathing, driving, playing, etc.** The fabric we wear, the brush and paste we use, the shampoo, the talcum powder, the oil we apply, everything is the consequence of advancement of science. Life is unimaginable without all this, as it has become a necessity. To help children imagine and to develop their senses and over all awareness, Ruchika runs Science on Wheels program for the children living in the slums with an aim to popularize Science among the young children and encouraging children to explore the utility of science in everyday life.

A bus designed with Science and Math models visits different slums and the Science teacher deliberates Science sessions to inculcate a scientific tempo among the children. The Science on Wheels also reaches out to the government schools. This program offers disadvantaged children access to dynamic hands-on education that makes learning fun, awakens curiosity, encourages questioning, enhances understanding and fosters creative thinking, problem solving and communication skills.



Educating girls for Social Change:

Girl child education is one of the most critical areas of empowerment for women. Offering girls basic education is one sure way of giving them much greater power of enabling them to make genuine choices over the kind of lives they wish to lead. 41 numbers of bright slum girls were sponsored to school this year with all education materials, school fees and remedial education support. This year 06 girls have completed High School Certificate Examination. The funds received from WCPCR award is used for the purpose.



Home for Homeless:

There were about 1.8 million homeless individuals living in India as of 2019. Over half of this population was living in urban areas, such as slums on the edge of cities. Ruchika has set up a Home at Paradeep for Homeless people. The needy people are accommodated at night with food at a subsidised rate and other services. During this year Ruchika provided shelter service to 600 homeless people.

We are not Lockdown:

The worldwide outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic left the world in a face of on an unprecedented crisis. Due to the enforced national lockdown in India, the lives of thousands marginalized people including daily wage earners, migrant workers along with their families, transgender, the elderly people etc. were crumbling down. The worst affected population was children especially those living on the streets and in the slums and the differently-abled children. They are not only affected by the disease itself, the pandemic has affected them in many forms. Children were found sleeping on the street in hungry pangs and even without a cloth. Medical service was almost a distant dream during this crisis. Horrifyingly many children were exposed to all kinds of abuse and exploitation including sexual abuses. In response to the situation, Ruchika started the following interventions.



1. Relief in kinds (dry ration and hygiene materials) provided to 150 transgender twice during the pandemic.
2. 120 families of children with disabilities were provided with ration, hygiene and sanitary materials.
3. 50 slum families who were deprived of ration card were provided with dry ration.
4. The families of 200 children living in the street situations were provided with dry nutrition.
5. 600 slum children and 200 slum community people in Bhubaneswar were provided with masks and soaps with health advice in 15 slums of Bhubaneswar.
6. Sanitation materials were provided to 800 families in Dhenkanal and 800 families in Choudwar.

- Sanitation kit including PPE Kit were provided to the 300 frontline workers.
- Sanitation materials and equipments were provided at 21 community toilets at both Choudwar and Dhenkanal.
- A group of 09 volunteers worked day and night to reach out to the Covid infected families and was providing all necessities.
- Dr. Bholeswar Panda and Dr. Sushil Kumar Mohanty were engaged voluntarily who were providing medical advice to the Covid patients and the family members of the Covid infected families.
- All the team members of Childline visited different street corners, identified the street children and reaching out to them for any emergency and with food and sanitary materials. All were provided with Covid education.



Special Activities:

Introducing to Online Teaching:

School closure due to Covid outbreak has resulted the children attending online classes . Ruchika introduced online education through YouTube Platform for the children all over Odisha. Our Teachers have prepared videos in OBS studio and uploaded videos in YouTube. The video links were shared to all children, parents and community members through WhatsApp group to continue the education during the pandemic.

Participation of Children in Bande Utkal Janani Program:

Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik had on May 28, 2020 issued a clarion call to all people of Odisha to come together and sing “BandeUtkal Janani” at 5.30 pm on May 30, 2020 to motivate the efforts of COVID warriors, who have played a major role in keeping the life of people safe from the infection of corona virus and who have been working day and night, with sacrifice and commitment. Thousands of people sang the song “Bande Utkal Janani” On the invitation of Commissionarate Police, the children from remedial education centre participated with placards, banners and Gandhi Caps to encourage frontline Corona warriors. In this program, DCP, Police Sri Anoop Sahu, traffic DCP Ms. Sagarika Nath, Social Activist and many other police officers and traffic police participated and sang Bande Utkal Janani together with our children.



Creating Scientific Temperment among Children :

Science education plays vital role in the present context and scientific knowledge makes the children more realistic and confident. Inorder to provide Scientific Education to Children Ruchika has organized an exposure visit for children to Regional Science Centre, Bhubaneswar. The objective was to create interest among the slum children in science and to enhance scientific knowledge among children. 1293 No's of children including the children of remedial centers and Balika Mondol girls visited the Science Centre. A team of Scientists from Science center demonstrated various scientific experiments before the children which helped to increase the scientific knowledge among the children.



Awards & Recognition received:

In recognition to the innovative work Ruchika has received a number of awards and recognitions. Most important ones are the Worlds Children's Prize for the Rights of the Child (WCPRC) – Sweden which is known as “Children's Nobel Prize”, World of Children Award, US, 'National Award' from the Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India, Shining Leadership Award, US, American Public Broadcasting (PBS) has selected the founder as one of the ten New Heroes in the world and has telecasted the work of the organisation in USA, Europe & in UN General Assembly. Outlook Magazine, selected, the founder as one of the 50 Change Makers. UNICEF has made a Film on Ruchika's program.
